

CITY ADMINISTRATOR REPORT DECEMBER 2018

The Mayor, City Council and City Staff have been working diligently for the past three months to develop the City's annual budget for the 2019 fiscal (calendar) year. We are happy to report that the City's 2019 General Fund Budget will result in a slight decrease (-0.66%) of the City's property tax levy rate. Therefore, the current 2018 City Property Tax Rate of \$7.73 (per \$1,000 of assessed property valuation) will slightly decrease to \$7.68 for property taxes payable in 2019. As a result, the City of Mosinee's property taxes for a \$100,000 assessed valued property will decrease -\$5.06 for the 2019 property tax year.

We are also very pleased to inform you that the overall (City, School District, County & Technical College) payable 2019 property taxes within the City will be lower than the overall payable 2018 property taxes. For example, a property with a \$100,000 assessed valuation will have an overall property tax decrease of approximately -\$17.38 for the 2019 payable property tax year!

The City is not planning to undertake any major street reconstruction or resurfacing projects next year, but the budget still includes \$60,000 for routine street maintenance work (i.e.: crack-sealing & seal-coating) to be completed during the year. It is important to note that the City has either reconstructed or resurfaced twenty-four (24) streets in the last four years. The 2019 budget also includes funding for the purchase of a new police squad to replace a 2002 squad that will be sold. A copy of the approved 2019 City Budget is available for review at City Hall and the budget is also available on the City's website (www.mosinee.wi.us).

On November 16th, Mayor Jacobson and members of the City Council attended a Mosinee Area Chamber of Commerce ribbon-cutting ceremony to welcome the opening of the Mosinee Brewing Company in our downtown area. We would like to congratulate owner Jaquelyn Forbes Kearns on the opening of this much anticipated business; and we would like to thank Ms. Kearns for investing and believing in our great community!

SECURE YOUR MAILBOX

Reminder to Check Your Mailbox Before Snowplowing Season *Please inspect your mailbox and post to insure that it is installed properly.* Just a reminder to make sure mail boxes are sturdy and able to withstand the force of plowed snow. Make sure the posts are solid in the ground, and boxes will not pop off if a pile of snow is pushed against it. Rotted wood posts and rusted steel posts will not withstand the weight of snow being pushed against them. Plow Operators are instructed to be cautious near mail boxes. In most cases a properly installed mail box will permit a snow plow to clear snow around it. Most cases of damaged mail boxes are caused by heavy snow hitting the box. The mail boxes are not usually hit by the plow. A mailbox with alleged damage from a direct hit by a City snow plow must be reported immediately and will be visually inspected by City staff. It is the policy of the City to only reimburse the owner for mail boxes broken from coming in direct contact with the plow.
