"HOW TO" RECYCLING INFORMATION

Materials to be Commingled	What Do I Recycle?	Cleaning and Preparation	What <u>Can't</u> Be Recycled?
Glass	Glass food and beverage containers: only clear, green and brown.	Remove and discard caps and rings and rinse thoroughly	Glass – blue, dishes, light bulbs, window glass, etc.
Aluminum	Cans ONLY	RINSE CLEAN, Flattening Optional	Foil and Bottle Caps
Tin & Steel Cans	Tin, Steel and bi-metal beverage and food cans	RINSE CLEAN Flattening Optional, You may leave the lid inside the can	Cardboard Sides Juice Cans, Aerosol Cans, Paint Cans
Plastic	Milk, Soda, and Detergent Bottles, Other Bottles marked #1 PETE or #2 HDPE	RINSE CLEAN Remove and Discard Lids in Trash	Styrofoam, Plastic Cups and Film, Hard Plastic (Toys, Pails, etc.) Medicine Bottles & Syringes and Plastic bags

Recycling Rules

- ✓ Glass, aluminum, tin, steel cans, & plastics may be mixed together in one container.
- ✓ All non-recyclable materials shall be placed in the *TRASH* container.
- ✓ Newspapers, and Magazines may be bundled or placed in a brown paper bag. Cardboard must be flattened.
