

## FROM THE DESK OF THE MAYOR:

Dear Mosinee Resident:

I hope this letter finds you enjoying the last of our pleasant summer days and looking forward to a colorful fall season. I am writing to provide you with another update from City Hall and the Mayor's Office.

This past month I was honored to be invited to a luncheon sponsored by the school district to welcome new teachers who are joining the district this year. New teachers were reminded that the City considers itself a partner with the school district and offers itself as a resource to our educators in any way that it can. I personally enjoyed all of my years in the Mosinee school system and I feel I received a great education. I am sure our many new teachers will find Mosinee to be a great place to teach and a great community to be a part of.

I welcome all residents to join the Common Council at our September meeting. Among other things, the Council will be considering a design services proposal for landscaping within our roundabout. I have updated you on this effort in the past and after working with the DOT and searching out a design firm, we are prepared to move forward.

At our August meeting, the Council also heard a report from a structural engineer on the status of an old dental clinic building downtown that the City previously purchased. At our September meeting, the Council will hopefully entertain proposals for demolition of the building in order to create additional public parking downtown.

After finding numerous streets in need of repair within the City, the Council moved forward with financing plans at our August meeting for reconstructing or repairing a list of streets over the next several years. I am happy to report that at the August meeting, the Council approved a bid for the reconstruction of one of the streets in our business park this fall. More road repairs in our very important business park will follow over the next several years, all of which are anticipated to be financed with tax dollars created by the businesses within the park.

As mentioned in a previous update, we also found a large amount of public works equipment was in desperate need of repair or replacement. Therefore, the Council has also approved financing to address several of these concerns in the near future.


The City will also soon be starting its annual budget process. This process is spread over four meetings, with the first meeting set for October 5, 2015. During these meetings, the Council will be making many important funding decisions. I encourage all interested residents to attend. For a complete budget schedule and budget materials please contact City Hall.

Finally, at our September Planning Commission meeting, the Commission approved a resolution to amend our business park tax incremental district to allow it to share excess tax increment with our other tax incremental district that extends from downtown and across the bridge to the old grocery store. This unique option available through state tax laws will allow us to complete certain eligible improvement projects within the community without having to borrow money from the state trust fund loan or issue debt in the form of bonds.

I wish you all a great start to the fall season that is upon us and I look forward to updating you next month.
