## NOTICE - DOG/CAT OWNERS

Dogs and Cats are required to be licensed by March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025. The license period runs from January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025 to December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025. State law requires that all dogs must be licensed <u>yearly</u> AND City ordinances require cats to be licensed yearly. Before a license can be issued, you must furnish a rabies vaccination certificate to show proof of vaccination against rabies.
